The official opening of the 44th Parliament took place on Tuesday 12th November 2013, It was an honour and a privilege to be sworn in as the federal parliamentary representative for the residents of Mitchell for a third term. The official opening is full of ceremony and tradition including, starting the day with a church service, the welcome to country ceremony and the swearing in of the House of Representative members. I also had the immense pleasure of being introduced by the newly-elected **Speaker, the Hon Bronwyn Bishop MP** to Her Excellency the Governor-General, the **Honourable Quentin Bryce AC** CVO.

On the first day of Parliamentary Business, the Prime Minister, the Hon Tony Abbott MP began the process of repealing the carbon tax by introducing the Clean Energy Legislation (Carbon Tax Repeal) Bill 2013. This is a fulfilment of our election promise to introduce the legislation within the first Parliamentary sitting week – an indication of the importance we place on this legislation. Some of the other bills introduced were The Building and Construction Industry (Improving Productivity) Bill 2013 and Minerals Resource Rent Tax Repeal and Other Measures Bill 2013.

#### **THANK YOU to the Mitchell Community**

Our Prime Minister, the Hon. Tony Abbott MP recently said "When nature is at its worst, Australians tend to be at their best".

I would like to commend the many fine volunteer organisations in the electorate of Mitchell who have assisted those in their time of need during the recent bushfire crisis which affected people across Western Sydney and across NSW. I pay tribute to those in my community who sacrificed their time to help others.

- To those in the Box Hill/Nelson, Kellyville, North Rocks, Rouse Hill and the Hills Rural Fire Service Brigades who fought the blazes alongside fellow volunteers from across the Eastern Seaboard, our thanks to you for your bravery and determination.
- To the 95 <u>Hills State Emergency Services</u> (SES) volunteers who assisted in the fire affected areas of the Blue Mountains, the Hawkesbury and the Hills districts between 13th October and 9th November.
- To Castle Hill RSL and Crowne Plaza Norwest for looking after fire crews from across New South Wales.
- To the members of <u>St John Ambulance Hills Division</u> gave up their time to attend to the fire crews at their base at Homebush as well as being on duty at the Evacuation Centre on the UWS Campus at Hawkesbury. Members of Hills Division were previously deployed to Coonabarabran earlier this year to assist the Fire Crews in the base camp at the racecourse. The fine work of the St John Ambulance and the contribution they make should be recognised and celebrated.

# Ballot opens for 100th Anniversary commemorations at Gallipoli



Australians who would like the opportunity to attend **ANZAC Day commemorations** at **Gallipoli in 2015** can apply for the ballot now.

The 100th anniversary of the landing of the Australian and New Zealand Army Corps at Gallipoli will be very significant commemorative occasion for the people of both nations. Places will be available for 8,000 Australians, 2,000 New Zealanders and 500 official representatives of all countries involved in the Gallipoli campaign including Turkey.

Ballots will be held for both the Australian and New Zealand places. The ballots **close at midnight on 31 January 2014** and applicants will be notified of the outcome in March 2014 to allow enough time for those successful to make their travel arrangements and pay for the trip.

## Australian Building and Construction Commission



The Government last week introduced legislation into the Federal Parliament to re-establish the Australian Building and Construction Commission. The Building and Construction Industry (Improving Productivity) Bill 2013 would re-establish the Australian Building and Construction Commission to stamp out lawlessness and improve productivity on building sites.

The Bill will restore the ABCC to ensure that, on commercial building sites, the rule of law is respected, productivity is improved, jobs are created and major national construction projects are kept on track.

Your Australian Business – an initiative founded in the Hills to assist overseas business harness the opportunities of expanding their operations to Australia – recently worked with the University of Western Sydney's School of Business.

Final year Marketing and International Business students under the direction of Senior Lecturer, Hugh Pattinson conducted an in-depth research study on behalf of Your Australian Business as part of their final year assessment. Five project groups were formed and given the task of preparing a feasibility study on possible markets for Your Australian Business including South Africa (Johannesburg), USA (California), India (Mumbai), the UK (London) and Ireland (Dublin and Galway).

"The depth of knowledge and detail that the students put into the presentations was very impressive – it has given us a great insight into potential new markets for Your Australian Business to explore in 2014" said Marketing Director, Tony Eades.

The International Business Project subject is a capstone industry-based initiative where students in project groups work with a client to produce International/Global Market Entry Feasibility Studies. In recent years they have worked with award winning innovators and exporters producing over 30 International/Global Market Entry Feasibility Studies covering several products and services for markets in Asia, North America, Europe and Africa.
