The shooting down of Malaysian Airlines Flight MH17 was an unspeakable crime and the loss of 298 lives, including 37 men, women and children who called Australia home is a horrific tragedy.

The Australian Government is committed to Operation Bring Them Home. There are now over 200 Australian personnel deployed overseas on the operation. Air Chief Marshal Angus Houston AC AFC (retired) is leading Australia's efforts on the ground in Ukraine to help recover, identify and repatriate Australians killed.

Australia played a pivotal role in authoring the resolution adopted by the United Nations Security Council, calling on the armed separatist groups controlling the MH17 crash site to allow unfettered access to the international investigators.

The Prime Minister has established a National Condolence Book so members of the public can record their condolence to the families and loved ones of those lost on Flight MH17. The National Condolence Book has been placed in the Marble Foyer, Parliament House, Canberra. You can also contribute a message of condolence online.

Condolence books have also been placed in Australia's embassies and high commissions throughout the world. In time, a copy of the condolence books will be provided to each of the Australian families who have been affected by this tragedy.

The Prime Minister, the Hon Tony Abbott MP, has announced Thursday, 7 August 2014 to be a National Day of Mourning and National Memorial Service to honour the victims of Flight MH17. The Memorial Service will take place at St Patrick's Cathedral, Melbourne at 10:30am.

My thoughts and prayers continue to be with the families affected by this tragedy, as I know they are in yours.

Abbott Government Abolishes Carbon Tax



The Coalition promised to abolish the Carbon Tax and the last week of July sitting in Parliament the <u>Government delivered on its promise</u>. The Repeal of the Carbon Tax is great news for local families and small businesses.

Scrapping the Carbon Tax will save the average household around \$550 a year, including around \$200 on the average household electricity bill and around \$70 on the average gas bill. This will reduce cost of living pressures for all Australians.

The Government's consumer watchdog, the ACCC, has been given extra funding and powers to ensure that savings are passed on to consumers.

Scrapping the Carbon Tax will also take a cost burden off local businesses. This will make it easier for them to compete and employ more people. Scrapping the Carbon Tax is just one part of our plan to build a stronger economy and create more jobs. It is also important we get the Budget under control, continue to reduce paperwork and build the infrastructure we need, like the NorthConnex.

There's much more to do, but removing the world's biggest Carbon Tax from the backs of everyday small businesses and families is an important step in building a stronger economy.
