Federal Parliament resumed this week and the Prime Minister announced further important counter terrorism measures to lessen the terrorism threat within Australia and overseas. The measures the Government are proposing on your behalf can be found here.

The Australian Government is developing a new <u>Defence White Paper</u> to be released in 2015. The 2015 Defence White Paper will reflect the Government's overall strategic, national security, fiscal and broader policy priorities. Over the next three months, the external Defence White Paper Expert Panel will lead a programme of community consultation and a <u>public submissions</u> process through which individuals and organisations can provide input to the development of the 2015 Defence White Paper.

The closing date for public submissions is Wednesday, 29 October 2014. For further information, visit www.defence.gov.au/whitepaper.

Separately I have expressed my concerns with proposals for government to increase its capacity to access and store our metadata via private companies.

My remarks are contained here.

This week, students and staff at <u>Hills Adventist College</u> in Kellyville celebrated the opening of their Senior School Block that was built with the help of \$650 000 in Australian Government funding.

I had the immense honour to formally open the new facilities on behalf

of the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Education, Senator the Hon Scott Ryan.

The project, totalling over \$2.3 million, was funded through a \$650 000 Australian Government grant, and by a contribution from Hills Adventist College of over \$1.7 million.

The project involved the construction of a two storey block which is the first stage of the Senior School building programme. The first floor consists of two science laboratories, a preparation area, storage, a chemical storage cupboard and staff offices. On the ground floor is the food technology room, a preparation area and pantry, a laundry, staff offices, a function room and a textile laboratory. On both floors are student amenities and student locker bays.

Australian Government funding was provided through the <u>Capital</u> <u>Grants Programme</u>.

On Saturday, 16 August 2014, I attended the Charter Night of the Rotary Club of Vinegar Hill – our newest Rotary Club in the Hills district. The Club is named after the historical Battle of Vinegar Hill. This a new vibrant club headed by Rotarians, Haran Ramachandran, President and Vice President, Steven Dinte.

Unlike other Rotary Clubs, the Rotary Club of Vinegar Hill is a "coffee club", which meets weekly at the Griddle Restaurant in the Rouse Hill Town Centre. They are also a family club, which means that members are encouraged to bring any of their family, including children, to the meetings.

Counter Terrorism Measures for a safer Australia

The Australian Government recently announced <u>\$630 million of new counter-terrorism measures</u> that will help combat the threat posed by home-grown terrorism and also, discourage or deter Australians from travelling offshore to participate in conflicts.

As part of its \$630 million Counter-Terrorism package the Government will invest:

- \$13.4 million to strengthen community engagement programmes in Australia with an emphasis on preventing young Australians from becoming involved with extremist groups;
- \$6.2 million to establish a new Australian Federal Police Community Diversion and Monitoring Team for returning foreign fighters and those who support them;
- \$32.7 million for a multi-agency national disruption group to

- investigate, prosecute and disrupt foreign fighters and their supporters; and
- \$11.8 million for the Australian Federal Police to bolster its ability to respond to the threat of foreign fighters at home and abroad including local and regional Liaison Officers and two new investigative teams to help reduce the threat of extremists leaving Australia.
- \$64 million in measures to <u>counter violent extremism and</u> radicalisation.

I strongly support these increased measures that will deter people from participating in conflicts and will reduce the incidents of false documents for travel.

National Flag Day - September 3



<u>Australian National Flag Day</u> is on **Wednesday, 3 September 2014** and all Australians are encouraged to fly the flag on September 3 to remind us of the common pride we have in our nation.

As Australia's foremost national symbol it is appropriate that we honour the place and importance of the Australian National Flag.

I encourage individuals, community organisations, local authorities, businesses and schools to celebrate Australian National Flag Day by flying or displaying the Australian National Flag on 3 September.
