The Mitchell Stronger Communities Programme - Round 1 is now open. Local community and sporting groups are invited to apply for funding for new projects.

The Stronger Communities Programme is to fund small capital projects which will deliver social benefits. The program aims to improve local community participation, cohesion and contribute to vibrant and viable communities.

Key aspects of the program:

- Please submit details of your <u>proposed project</u> to my office by 5pm, Friday 9 October 2015.
- Local government and incorporated not-for-profit organisations are eligible to apply.
- Grants of between \$5,000 and up to a maximum of \$20,000 are available. There is a total funding pool of \$150,000 for 2015/16 year for the Mitchell electorate.
- Applicants are required to confirm matched funding in cash or in-kind on at least a dollar-for-dollar basis.
- Following consultation, the Mitchell Stronger Communities Committee will provide identified applicants with access to an online application form. Applicants will only be able to apply for funding once a link to the online form has been provided by my office.

Expressions of interest for the grant can be made by downloading the form and sending to my electorate office at Alex Hawke MP, PO Box 1173, Castle Hill NSW 1765 or via email or click here to lodge online.

In my role as a Member of Parliament, it is always a privilege to recognise and honour veterans for their service to our nation.

The Castle Hill RSL Sub-branch was in touch with <u>Warren Miller</u> from Rowland Village, Galston, assisting with replacing his lost medals for his service during the Vietnam War. I recently hosted a <u>presentation ceremony</u> for Warren Miller where he was presented with full sized and miniature medals and a Certificate of Appreciation. The ceremony was attended by his family, friends and Castle Hill Sub-branch members.

Saluting Their Service Commemorations Grants



On 18 August 2015, the <u>Minister for Veterans' Affairs</u>, Senator the Hon. Michael Ronaldson announced funding to assist local communities in honouring the service of our Vietnam veterans.

The program will award grants of between \$4,000 and \$20,000 for initiatives such as commemorative events and activities that directly commemorate any aspect of the Vietnam War, and which focus on camaraderie. The grant programme will open for funding on 14 September 2015 and closes at 5:00 pm AEDT on 31 October

2015. The Department is currently updating the STS Guidelines and Application Forms for these grants and they will be available <u>here</u>

when the funding round opens.

The <u>Saluting Their Service grants</u> are designed to support activities and projects that highlight the sacrifice and service of Australia's servicemen and women.

- Community Commemorative Grants are available of up to \$4,000 for projects, to build memorials and preserve wartime memorabilia that are locally significant. Applications can be submitted to the Department of Veterans' Affairs at any time for consideration by the Commemorations Grants Advisory Committee.
- <u>Major Commemorative Grants</u> are for significant projects that contribute to Australia's understanding of its wartime heritage and honour the service and sacrifice of its servicemen and women.
 Round 2 applications close on 3 January 2016.

School Competition To Honour Australia's Vietnam Veterans



Secondary schools in Mitchell are invited to participate in the Australian Government's *Honouring Australian Vietnam Veterans* schools' competition. The competition encourages students in Year 9 and 10 to explore the service of Australia's Vietnam veterans, and to reflect on the importance of remembering their involvement in the conflict. The competition is open from **Tuesday**, **18 August 2015 until Friday**, **8 April 2016**, giving students two full terms to participate.

Winning students will be invited to attend a three-day Canberra Commemorative Programme in August 2016, where they will attend the national commemorative event marking the 50th anniversary of the Battle of Long Tan.

Securing Australian Shipbuilding



The Commonwealth Government announced it is delivering a long-term plan for a strong and sustainable <u>shipbuilding industry</u>. Over the next 20 years the Government will invest over \$89 billion in ships and submarines for the Navy. We will also implement a continuous build of surface warships in Australia. This means that Australia's shipbuilding workforce will build Navy's Future Frigates and Offshore Patrol Vessels.

The Coalitions Government's historic investment in Navy capability will be a centrepiece of the fully-funded <u>Defence White Paper</u> due to be released later this year.
