Saluting Their Service Commemorations Grants



The <u>Saluting Their Service grants</u> are designed to support activities and projects that highlight the sacrifice and service of Australia's servicemen and women.

- Community Commemorative Grants are available of up to \$4,000 for projects, to build memorials and preserve wartime memorabilia that are locally significant.
 Applications can be submitted to the Department of Veterans' Affairs at any time for consideration by the Commemorations Grants Advisory Committee.
- Vietnam War Commemorative Grants (VWCG) Grants between \$4,000 and \$20,000 are available for community-based commemorative projects and activities that directly commemorate any aspect of the Vietnam War, and which focus on camaraderie.
- Major Commemorative Grants are for significant projects that contribute to Australia's understanding of its wartime heritage and honour the service and sacrifice of its servicemen and women.
- The Veteran and Community Grants (V&CG) program aims to improve the independence and quality of life for members of the veteran community. This program provides funding for projects that support activities and services to sustain or enhance health and wellbeing.
